The Center offers in-resident courses, workshops and dialogues in Honolulu and the Indo-Pacific region, and conducts policy-relevant research to build security capacity and collaboration. DKI APCSS addresses traditional and non-traditional security issues, including the relationship between governance and the security sector; transnational threats such as organized crime, terrorism, violent extremism, trafficking; maritime security; crises; analytical security assessments; and whole-of-society collaboration to include the role of women, peace and security. The audience of Fellows are mid- to senior-level civilian and military officials from all over the world. The Daniel K. Inouye Asia-Pacific Center for Security Studies is located in Honolulu, Hawaii.

FACULTY MEMBER

The Center seeks world-class educators to teach, facilitate, research, and build capacity in the Indo-Pacific Region: Responsibilities include:

- Teaching executive education courses in a participant-centered, activity-based context
- Facilitating seminars and workshops in residential courses, regional seminars, and workshops
- Contributing to capacity building endeavors and security cooperation projects in the region
- Contributing analysis of security-related trends in the Asia-Pacific region
- Contributing to curriculum development
- Performing administrative and staff duties to support the Center's academic functions

Of particular interest are candidates with expertise in the following areas:

- **Violent Extremism/Terrorism:** Background and understanding of violent extremism and terrorism, broadly defined.

- **Transnational Crime, Organized Crime, Combatting Illicit Activities:** Background understanding in any of these areas, whether through academic training or government practice

Ideal candidates will possess the following:

- Master's Degree or PhD in a related area or discipline.
- Proven ability in teaching and seminar facilitation.
- Proven ability to function as a team member.

The following are preferred for all faculty positions:

- Experience working in the Asia-Pacific region
- Expertise in the security sector of one or more Asia-Pacific countries.
- Familiarity with facilitation-based teaching, and state-of-the-art educational technology.
- Professional expertise at the operational, strategic or policy level in a whole-of-government or multilateral setting.

Salary and rank are commensurate with qualifications. Salary range is \$90,789 - \$120,157 excludes locality pay (18.43%) and cost of living allowance (COLA), currently 10.99% but subject to change). These are limited-term, excepted-service positions, for up to three years (with the possibility of renewal). Relocation expenses may be authorized.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

1. Interested candidates should submit the following items:

a. **LETTER OF INTEREST.** Provide a brief description of your vocational goals, personal interests and expected areas of study in the coming year, and explain your interest in future career considerations with the Department of Defense.

b. **CURRICULUM VITAE.** Should reflect the following: educational background, work experience, publications and salary history.

c. **TWO LETTERS OF REFERENCE.**

d. **TRANSCRIPT(s).** Provide bona fide transcripts from the academic institutions granting advance degree(s).

1. Application deadline: 31 August 2018.

2. Applications will be considered against current Faculty requirements. Application packages will be retained for one year.
